



MADDY ACT - LOCAL APPOINTMENTS LIST

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City of Goleta encourages residents to apply for applications on City Boards, Commissions, and Committees that will have vacancies in 2020.

Pursuant to the Maddy Local Appointive List Act, the following represents the term of appointive offices currently vacant or expiring during the calendar year 2020. Persons interested in serving on a City Board, Commission or Committee should contact the City Clerk's office at (805) 961-7505.

It should be noted that applications for all Boards and Commissions or Committees are accepted throughout the year and will be considered should a vacancy occur.

The Planning Commission shall have such duties as are prescribed by California law, including the following:

- A. Assist in reviewing proposed general plan amendments and community or specific plans and hold public hearings on such plans;
- B. Hold hearings and make recommendations to the City Council with regard to proposed amendments to the General Plan and specific plan;
- C. Make recommendations to the City Council regarding reasonable and practical means for implementing the General Plan or elements of the General Plan, so that it will serve as an effective guide for orderly growth and development, preservation and conservation of open space and natural resources, and the efficient expenditure of public funds relating to the subjects addressed in the general plan;
- D. Provide an annual report to the City Council on the status of the General Plan and progress in its implementation, including the progress in meeting the City's share of the regional housing needs determined pursuant to Government Code Section 65584, local efforts to remove governmental constraints on housing pursuant to Government Code Section 65583(c)(3), and compliance of the General Plan with the guidelines contained at Government Code Section 65040.2;
- E. Hold hearings and make recommendations to the City Council with regard to proposed changes to the zoning ordinance and zoning maps;
- F. Hold hearings and make recommendations to the City Council on tentative subdivision maps;
- G. Annually review the Capital Improvement Program of the City and the local public works projects of other local agencies for their consistency with the City's General Plan and make recommendations to the City Council;
- H. Report and make recommendations to the City Council on the conformity of proposed public land acquisition or disposal with the adopted General Plan; and
- I. Conduct concept review of certain major discretionary projects. (Ord. 09-01 § 3; Ord. 07-13 § 1)

The Commission shall consist of five members. Members of the Commission shall be residents of the City for the year immediately preceding the inception of the term, and shall be qualified electors within the City. No member of the Commission may be an employee or officer of the City. Members of the Commission shall be appointed for a four year term which shall expire at the first regular meeting of the first February following the expiration of the current term of office of the City Council member who appointed the Commission member. There is no limit as to the number of times that a Commission member may be appointed.

The Design Review Board encourages development that exemplifies the best professional design practices so as to enhance the visual quality of the environment, benefit surrounding property values, and prevent poor quality of design. These guidelines establish the procedures that govern both the Design Review Board members and the Design Review Board meetings in order to ensure uniformity of procedure, fairness to the public and interested parties, and compliance with legal requirements in matters heard by the Design Review Board. The Design Review Board shall be composed of seven members, appointed by the City Council. Of the seven members, a minimum of four shall be residents of the City. At least two members shall be licensed architects, and at least two members shall be licensed landscape professionals (landscape architect or landscape contractor). The three at-large members must reside within the City. The City Council may also appoint one or more alternates to the Design Review Board. Such alternates may participate in all general Design Review Board matters, but may only vote on a project approval or other Board decision when a regular Design Review Board member is absent or recused from a meeting. The members shall be skilled in reading and interpreting architectural and landscape drawings and able to judge the effects of a proposed building, structure, landscaping or sign upon the desirability and development of surrounding areas. Effective in February of each year, the City Council shall make appointments to the Design Review Board. Members of the Design Review Board shall be appointed for a term of three years. The terms of the members shall be staggered so that approximately one third of the members are appointed each year. Members shall serve until their successors are appointed by the City Council. The Public Tree Advisory Commission provides advice to staff and the City Council in developing plans and goals for the Goleta Urban Forest, represent the interests of the community and inform the community of the Urban Forestry program as directed by the City Council. The Public Tree Advisory Commission shall consist of five members. Following the procedures of California Government Code Section 54970, each Councilmember shall have the authority to nominate one member to the Public Tree Advisory Commission. The City Council shall vote on whether to appoint each nominee. Such appointment requires at least three affirmative votes. Members of the Public Tree Advisory Commission shall be residents of the City. Members of the Public Tree Advisory Commission should have an interest in and/or experience in urban forestry or landscaping. No member of the Public Tree Advisory Commission may be an employee or officer of the City. Each appointment of a Public Tree Advisory Commissioner shall be for a term equal to that of the Councilmember who nominated the Commissioner and shall expire when that Council seat is vacated or on the next Election Day for that nominating Councilmember, whichever event occurs first. If, after any Council seat is vacated or a City Council election a new Commissioner has not been selected, or a Commissioner's term has not been renewed, that Commissioner shall serve until a new appointment or renewal is made. There is no limit on the number of times that a Commissioner may be appointed.

The Parks and Recreation Commission provides citizens a platform to discuss the needs, opportunities and current offerings of parks and recreation activities in the City. The Commission shall advise the City Council all issues related to parks and recreational opportunities in Goleta. The Parks and Recreation Commission shall be composed of seven (7) members. One member shall be a student (15 years or older). Members of the Parks and Recreation Commission shall be residents of the City. No member of the Parks and Recreation Commission may be an employee or officer of the City. Members of the Parks and Recreation Commission shall be appointed to a four year term. The student commissioner shall serve a one year term.

Public Engagement Commission advises the City Council on issues related to public engagement in the governance of the City. The Commission will provide City residents a venue to address opportunities and ways to increase public engagement in City government. The Public Engagement Commission shall be composed of seven (7) members. One (1) member is a Goleta elections Committee appointment and one (1) member shall be a youth appointee between the ages of 15-21. Members of the Public Engagement Commission shall be residents of the City. No member of the Public Engagement Commission may be an employee or officer of the City. Members of the Public Engagement Commission shall be appointed for a term of four years. Initial appointments shall be staggered so that three commissioners initially serve two-year terms expiring November 2019. Members shall serve until their successors are appointed by the City Council. The Goleta Election Committee appointee would also serve a four year term. After the initial terms all commissioners shall serve four year terms.

Santa Barbara County Library Advisory Committee. reviews and maintains the master plan for each County library service zone, makes recommendations to insure adequate library services to all, determines the per capita level of service, reviews budgets, considers site locations and building programs, reviews the operation of the library. Member must reside within the City of Goleta. Each contracting city, namely Santa Maria, Lompoc, and Santa Barbara, shall nominate one member for appointment by the Board of Supervisors. In addition, the Cities of Carpinteria, Buellton, Guadalupe, Solvang, and Goleta, in recognition of their significant contributions to free library service within the County, may nominate one member for appointment by the Board of Supervisors, and the County Supervisor of each supervisorial district shall appoint one member. In recognition of County Service Area 3's significant contributions to free library service, the County Board of Supervisors shall appoint one member from the residents of County Service Area 3. The Supervisors shall further appoint one member of its Board, or a designee, to chair the Library Advisory Committee. The term limits are one-year, beginning on July 1 and ending June 30 of the following year.

Mosquito and Vector Management District Board of Santa Barbara County provides direction and governance to the District relating to vectors such as mosquitoes and rats and surveillance for vector-borne pathogens such as West Nile and St. Louis encephalitis viruses. Management services are provided to all lands, both private and public, within the enhanced services areas of Santa Barbara County and its political subdivisions. The District is governed by an eight member Board of Trustees; three trustees are appointed by the City Councils located within the benefit assessment areas—Goleta, Santa Barbara, and Carpinteria—and five trustees are appointed by the County of Santa Barbara's Board of Supervisors. The District's Board of Trustees meets on the second Thursday of each month at the Hope School Board Room, 3970 La Colina Road, Santa Barbara, California at 2:00 PM, to discuss District business and authorize fiscal and operational activity. Each person appointed by a city council to be a member of the board of trustees shall be a voter and resident of that city (Health and Safety Code 2022 (b)). Member must have experience, training and education in fields that will assist in the governance of the District. Except as provided in Health and Safety Code Section 2023, the term of office for a member of the board of trustees shall be for a term of two or four years, at the discretion of the appointing authority. Member must reside within the City of Goleta. Terms of office commence at noon on the first Monday in January.

Goleta Library Advisory Commission The purpose of the Library Advisory Commission (Commission) is to advise the Library Board of Trustees (Board) and increase citizen participation in library issues by analyzing the library's needs, considering goals, anticipating future needs and problems, acting as a liaison, acting as a sounding board, and helping to develop consensus for advisement to the Board. The Commission members shall be composed of five (5) members representative of the Goleta Library service area. Members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Mayor with the consent of the City Council. The Mayor will always appoint, and the City Council will always consent to three members suggested by the County Board of Supervisors. These members must be residents of the unincorporated service area of the Goleta Valley, and one of the three members must be a resident of the Isla Vista Community Services District (CSD). The remaining two members must be residents of the City of Goleta. The members of the first appointed Commission shall so classify themselves by lot that one of their number shall go out of office at the end of the next fiscal year (June 30, 2020), two at the end of the one year thereafter (June 30, 2021), and two at the end of two years thereafter (June 30, 2022). Terms shall be for three years, with no limit on the numbers of terms to which members may be appointed. Members shall serve until their successor has been appointed by the City Council.
